Assessment



School assessments measure student knowledge, skills, and understanding.



Assessments help teachers identify student strengths and weaknesses to improve learning.



Teachers gather information through tests, projects, observations, and discussions.



Assessments occur throughout the learning process, from the beginning to gauge prior knowledge to the end to measure learning outcomes.



Assessments can take place in the classroom, computer labs, libraries, or even outdoors depending on the activity.

Assessment Strategies for Stage of Education Focused on Deeper Learning

Moving Beyond Rote Learning

Assessment at this stage focuses on understanding concepts and higher-order thinking skills, not just memorization.



Formative Assessments for Deeper Learning

Teachers utilize various methods like projects, presentations, and student creations to assess students learning.



Regular Assessments & Feedback

Regular assessments, including MCQs and constructed responses, are used to track progress and provide feedback for improvement.



Middle Stage Assessment & Transition Planning

Variety in Assessments

In addition to written and oral tests, practical projects are introduced at the Middle Stage.



Detailed Year-End Evaluation

A comprehensive assessment at the end of each year determines student readiness for the next grade.



Support for Transition
